

## SELF-SUFFICIENCY POLICY

### Purpose

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) requires Partner4Work to set the criteria for determining whether employment leads to a self-sufficient wage.

### Affected Parties

This policy applies to all Pittsburgh/Allegheny County Adult and Dislocated Worker participants. Pittsburgh/Allegheny County WIOA Title I Adult and Dislocated Worker staff and Partner4Work staff are responsible for implementing this policy.

### Definition of Key Terms

The term “self-sufficiency” refers to the level of income a person or family must be below in order to be eligible for certain WIOA services. To qualify for a WIOA-funded training service, it must be determined that a client is unlikely or unable to obtain or retain employment at the self-sufficiency wage or wages comparable to or higher than wages from previous employment through career services alone.

### Eligibility Requirements

See the Partner4Work WIOA Adult/Dislocated Worker Eligibility policy for eligibility requirements for Adult and Dislocated Worker participants.

### Policy

Partner4Work has set the criteria for self-sufficiency at 250% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines. An individual in Allegheny County or City of Pittsburgh will be determined to be earning below the self-sufficiency wage if the following criteria are met:

1. The individual’s gross earned income is not above 250% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines; and
2. The individual is a member of a family whose combined gross earned income is not above 250% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines for its actual family size.

The chart below shows family size and the 250% Federal Poverty Guidelines levels.

## Federal Poverty Guidelines (2023)

1	\$14,580	\$36,450	\$17.52
2	\$19,720	\$49,300	\$23.70

6	\$40,280	\$100,700	\$48.41
7	\$45,420	\$113,550	\$54.59
8	\$50,560	\$126,400	\$60.77

The Self Sufficiency Wage, effective 01/30/2023, is **\$17.52/hour** for a family of one (1).
