SNAP referrals will be served by EARN starting July 1. A waiver was in place opting SNAP Able Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWDs) out of work requirements for PY19-20. The waiver is expected to be removed for PY20-21. The EARN program can anticipate serving an additional 50-150 participants with this waiver lifted.

From discussion with the CAO, we estimate that approximately 30% of TANF participants are Extended TANF. Between Work Ready and EARN that comes out to about 300 participants in Allegheny County. However, the number of ETANF participants is not evenly distributed. According to provider estimates, Wilkinsburg EARN serves higher numbers of ETANF (30/35%) than McKeesport (20/25%) or downtown (20/25%).

Recommendations:

Work Ready programs are changing dramatically and it is no longer enough to fund in a single location only. With changes going into effect on July 1, Partner4Work should implement sole source procurement under the justification that the public exigency or emergency for the requirement will not permit a delay resulting from competitive solicitation and award of Work Ready contracts to Grant and Goodwill for services in Wilkinsburg and McKeesport, respectively. People who attend Work Ready programming are unlikely to travel downtown for those services. We would put a plan in place to procure for July 1, 2021.

Recommendation: Partner4Work should enter into sole-sourced contracts with Grant Associates and Goodwill for WorkReady for the period of July 1, 2020-June 30, 2021.
